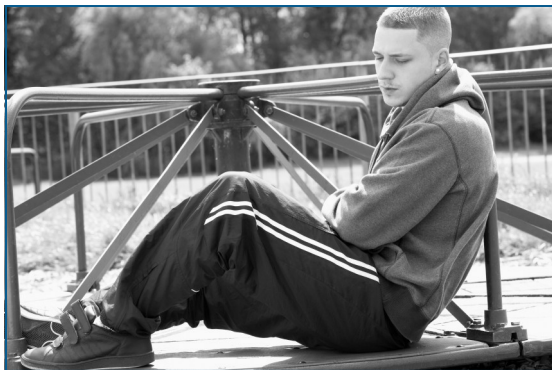




Outpatient Juvenile Competency Attainment Program

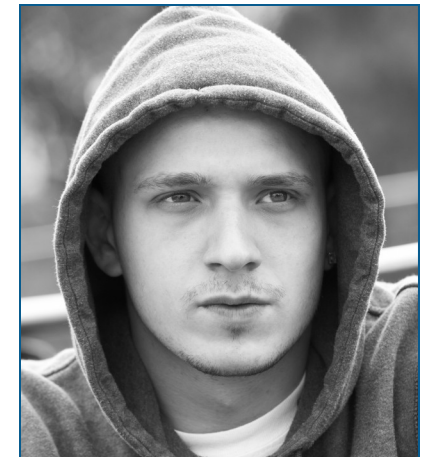

Outpatient Juvenile Competency Attainment Program





- ⚓ This multidisciplinary program meets requirements of Sections 2152.51-2152.59 of the Ohio Revised Code
- ⚓ Progress reports filed with the Court 30 days after the initiation of services and every 30 days thereafter
- ⚓ Re-assessments of competency done by Netcare psychologists employing the Juvenile Adjudicative Competency Interview (JACI) which assesses what the juvenile knows, understands, believes or can do that is relevant for competency to stand trial



- ⚓ Individualized treatment plan meets competency-related issues
- ⚓ Attainment services tailored to help the child comprehend the legal charge(s) and proceedings, assist in one's defense and comprehend consequences that may result from legal proceedings
- ⚓ Emphasis on symptom management techniques
- ⚓ Availability of child psychiatrist for medication, if necessary
- ⚓ Clinical services tailored to individual needs typically once-per-week individual sessions

Treatment duration dictated by the Ohio Revised Code, outpatient competency attainment services are provided for a period not exceeding three months if the child is charged with an act that would be a misdemeanor or if committed by an adult, six months if the child is charged with an act that would be a felony of the third, fourth, or fifth degree if committed by an adult, or one year if the child is charged with an act that would be a felony of the first or second degree, aggravated murder, or murder if committed by an adult.
